# **Returning Students**

### ALL PROCESSES HAVE TO BE COMPLETED BY:

If you have taken Dual Enrollment classes before, you are already in the system with and have an established MEID. If you plan to attend an additional Maricopa Community College, log in to the Admissions application to add a specific college to your existing student account.

### Before you begin, make sure you gather the following documents:

- MEID (User ID) and Password
- Review the school class list and class prerequisites and take note of the following:
  - Term, Course, Class #, Class Hour, Instructor, Credits (example: Fall 2022, ENG 101, 12345, 1st hour, Jones, 3)
  - Documentation or assessment may be required for course placement (example: High school transcripts, SAT/ACT scores, EdReady placement test).

Note: Dual Enrollment registration deadlines may vary from college to college. Please visit your Dual Enrollment college website of choice for registration information including deadlines.



### **Complete the Dual Enrollment Next Steps Form**

- 1. Set up DUO account.
- 2. Select a Maricopa Community College as your primary college.
- 3. Determine college readiness and course placement: Students must meet class prerequisites and provide proof or documentation, or will not be able to selfregister for classes.

For courses with prerequisites, refer to the <u>class</u> <u>list offerings</u> for the appropriate placement assessment tests required.

#### 9th Grade

• For courses with no prerequisites, the Edready College Reading placement assessment test is required to prove college readiness.

#### 10th Grade

- · ACT Aspire ELA Score of Ready.
- · High School PSAT, SAT score of 720 or higher, or a Composite ACT score of 12.
- EdReady College Reading placement assessment test.

#### 11th Grade and 12th Grade

- · Unofficial high school transcript, the unweighted GPA must be a 2.6 or higher.
- Other placement assessments may be needed for courses with prerequisites.

Please allow 7-10 business days (Monday-Friday) to verify and review the Dual Enrollment Next Steps Form before completing Step 4, self-registration. You will receive an email to your Maricopa student email account when you are approved to self-register.

## 2 Self-register for Classes

- Once you've received an email approval to self-register, visit <u>Student Tools</u> and click on Add a Class.
- Log in using your MEID@maricopa.edu (example: ABC1234567@maricopa.edu) and your password.
- 3. Select your Maricopa Community College and the term for which you are registering. To check your class information click here.
- 4. In the search bar, enter the **5-digit class section number** and click enter. Use the enter key or click the arrow button to the right.
- 5. If everything looks correct, click anywhere on the class row or the arrow on the far right.
- Click Enroll from drop down menu and click Submit. This Process can be repeated for multiple classes.

# **3 Pay Tuition and Fees**

#### To pay online:

- You can pay tuition, or sign up for the payment plan using <u>Student Tools</u> and click on <u>View</u> <u>Charges</u> or <u>Make a Payment</u>.
- 2. Click Select View Payment Options.
- 3. You may also pay over the phone or in-person at the college where you are dual enrolled. Please check your college Student Business Services for more information.

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Tuition assistance is available from the Maricopa Tuition Assistance Grant for those who qualify. You can apply for the Maricopa Grant (English | Spanish) to help with tuition costs. Maricopa Grant deadlines may vary by college to college.

### **Set-Up Duo Two-Factor Authentication**



Duo is Maricopa Community Colleges' two-factor authentication service providing an extra layer of security to protect against hackers, cyber threats, and any unauthorized access to sensitive data.
