Japanese Language & Psychology and Culture

Fukuoka, Japan | June 2-17, 2024

Required Online Coursework: May 13-31, 2024

Take advantage of this extraordinary opportunity in Fukuoka, Japan, where you will learn the language as well as conduct a psychological analysis of the traditional and current Japanese pop cultures.

Excursions will include visits to an automobile company, the Dazaifu Tenmangu shrine and Kyushu National and Kitakyushu Manga museums, participation in a Hakata doll painting and Japanese tea ceremony as well as the opportunity to watch a Japanese baseball game. You will also visit the Ohori Park Japanese Garden/Art Museum, visit local schools and have a kimono dress-up experience.

Highlights of your stay in Japan will include 4 nights with a local Japanese host family. This is a rare opportunity to establish relationships with Japanese people and to learn the way of life in Japan! Fukuoka was awarded Best in Travel 2023 by Lonely Planet!

Namibia Study Abroad

Namibia, Africa | May 20–June 14, 2024

Required Predeparture Coursework: May 13–17, 2024

A trek through the wilds of Africa will probably be the single most adventurous and exciting thing that you will ever do! In true safari style, you'll travel Namibia in 4x4 vehicles, exploring Africa's amazing wildlife, breathtaking landscapes, unique people and ecosystems. You'll visit Etosha Park with Africa's big five (lion, elephant, buffalo, rhino, leopard), come face to face with cheetahs at the Cheetah Conservation Fund, track desert elephants, stay at a Himba village, and bushcamp in the world's oldest desert. By exploring the wildlife, flora, people, and landscapes of Namibia you'll learn about global conservation, biodiversity and environmental issues, as well as the impact of expanding human populations and climate change. You'll use field techniques to census wildlife and examine environmental topics such as biodiversity loss. With a mix of wilderness bush camping, rest camps, relaxing starlight campfires, BBQ's, and unique wildlife everywhere, this will be the learning adventure of a lifetime! But you'll also have down time for optional activities like dune surfing and adventure sports at Swakopmund on Namibia's coast.

Marine Biology in Puerto Peñasco

Puerto Peñasco, Mexico (Rocky Point)

May 22–29, 2024

This introduction course to Marine Biology, designed for the non-major, will take you to the Sea of Cortez (our nearest ocean experience), which has one of the best intertidal expanses in the world! At low tide, as much as 300 feet of what was once covered by the sea is exposed. Students will visit and learn about different aquatic habitats as well the organisms that live there. They will take part in an ongoing scientific survey of intertidal organisms in local habitats as well as sea lions and local bird populations. In addition to biology, our study abroad also focuses on the effects of the ocean on local culture and business.

Educational excursions include talks from local experts on whales and other large animals of the Sea of Cortez (Gulf of California) at the Center for the Study of Deserts and Oceans (CEDO); bird-watching while kayaking through the Morua Estuary; a boat trip to Isla de San Jorge to view, snorkel or possibly scuba dive with a sea lion colony, and group excursions to explore the town of Puerto Peñasco in the evenings. Accommodations are in CEDO dormitories, the base of operations for the trip. The program includes transportation, lodging, some meals, and tuition.

Nice and the French Riviera

Nice, France | May 19–June 12, 2024

Required Online PreDeparture Coursework: May 16–18, 2024

Visit one of the most beautiful parts of the world in the Nice and French Riviera (Côte d'Azur) Study Abroad Program! Participants will be immersed in the history, language, and culture of this area that is bordered by the crystal blue waters of the Mediterranean and the grandeur of the French Alps. In addition, participants will explore the richness of the marine life and habitats of the area through activities such as kayaking, whale watching, scuba diving, and snorkeling.

The program's home is Nice, the 5th largest city in France. Classes are held in a school in the Liberation-Borriglione quarter of the city, where participants can enjoy the Mediterranean sun between classes in the school's garden. Nice is home to the famous Promenade des Anglais, which runs along its famous pebbled beach as well as several open-air markets and unique buildings.

Participants spend three weeks exploring the rich heritage of one of the world's most beautiful and diverse areas with excursions to Beaulieu sur Mer (Tempe Sister City), Antibes (kayaking), Cagnes sur Mer estuary, Villefrance-sur-Mer (whale watching/snorkeling/scuba), Monaco/Monte Carlo, and Villa Ephrussi de Rothschild. Students will also visit sites in Nice such as Musée Massena, Musée Marc Chagall, Musée Matisse, Musée Archéologique, Musée des Beaux-Arts de Nice, and Vieille Ville (Old Town).

Because the courses focus on the humanities and on marine biology, no knowledge of French is necessary. However, students will benefit from some short French lessons, taught by native speakers, that will help them converse in everyday situations in shops, restaurants, markets, and train stations. While in Nice, local families provide homestays (including breakfasts and dinners), thus providing an invaluable cultural, language, and food immersion experience.

The City of One Hundred Spires

Prague, Czech Republic | June 28–July 19, 2024

Predeparture Classes: June 17–26, 2024

Experience one of the most beautiful cities in Europe through the Prague Study Abroad Program! The Czech Republic is geographically situated in the center of Europe. Czechs like to think of their country as “the bridge between East and West.” Bordering Germany, Austria, Poland, and Slovakia, the country has always been an important crossroads.

Prague is also known as the “City of 100 Spires.” Its compact medieval center remains an evocative maze of cobbled lanes, ancient courtyards, mysterious passages, and churches beyond number, all watched over by a 1,000-year-old castle. Prague was one of the few European cities relatively untouched during the world wars, allowing its historic architecture to stay true to form. Prague is a traditional cultural center of Europe, hosting many festivals and concerts. A three-night excursion to Berlin, Germany, is included in the program barring no travel restrictions.

Study Abroad Ireland

Athlone, Republic of Ireland | June 2-July 1, 2024

Spend summer school in Ireland and see for yourself why the country is nicknamed the Emerald Island!

Held on the campus of Athlone Institute of Technology, located in Athlone, Co. Westmeath, you will spend a full month immersing in the study of Irish culture and history while exploring and experiencing the rich and diverse heritage of Ireland. Using picturesque Athlone as a home base, participants will make field trips to locations such as the prehistorical monuments at Loughcrew and the Hill of Uisneach, the early Medieval monastic city of Clonmacnoise and the Norman castles of Dunamase and Trim, and the 18th Century great house, Emo Court. You will also spend several days in Galway, Ireland's Cultural Heart, visiting the Burren, the Cliffs of Moher, and the island of Inis Mor, as well as a day-trip to Dublin City. Your Irish adventure will be a learning experience you will never forget!

Canterbury and London Study Abroad

Canterbury and London, England | June 14–28, 2024

Required Predeparture Classes: May 30–June 12, 2024
(two classes per week)

Required Post-trip Classes: July 8–10, 2024

Complement your learning with an immersive cultural and educational experience in England. For two weeks, continue your literature studies while staying in Canterbury, England, on the University of Kent campus—living among the local student population, learning in the school's classrooms, and experiencing college life at a British university. Take two full day trips to London to visit the Tower of London, the Portrait Gallery, St. Paul's Cathedral, and other amazing historical and cultural sites that England's capital has to offer. Visit the medieval Dover Castle, England's largest castle and one of most important historic fortresses in England's history, while looking across the sea at the White Cliffs of Dover. Study theory and literature while exploring where selected authors lived and witnessing the sites, settings, and inspirations of their work.

The University of Kent is a research-led British university with its main campus residing in Canterbury, England. Canterbury, the birthplace of Renaissance playwright Christopher Marlowe, is a beautiful small British town in southeastern England that retains a medieval feel. Located roughly 60 miles east of London and 150 miles northwest of Paris, Canterbury is home to the Canterbury Cathedral (the pilgrimage site that Chaucer's *Canterbury Tales* is based on) and the Benedictine monastery of St. Augustine's Abbey. The city is surrounded by medieval walls, the majority still with original construction; you can walk along the walls while touring the city or simply making your way to a restaurant.

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program

The U.S. Department of State's Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program enables American undergraduate students with high financial need to study or intern abroad through scholarships of up to \$5,000. Students studying critical need languages are eligible for scholarships up to \$8,000. For over 20 years, the Gilman Program has provided access and opportunity to study abroad for more than 38,000 exceptional U.S. undergraduate students, who have gained skills critical to their personal and professional development, as well as for our national security and economic prosperity.

- Undergraduate student in good academic standing
- Federal Pell Grant recipient
- Participating in credit-based program abroad up to an academic year in length
- In the process of applying for, or accepted to, a credit-bearing study abroad or internship program in a country with an overall Travel Advisory of 1 or 2 according to the U.S. Department of State Travel Advisory System.

Gilman-McCain Scholarship for Undergraduate Dependents (child or spouse) of Active or Activated Military Personnel

The U.S. Department of State's John S. McCain International Scholarship for Military Families (Gilman-McCain Scholarship) provides awards of \$5,000 for undergraduate dependents (child or spouse) of active or activated United States military personnel to study or intern abroad on credit-bearing programs. Developed under the framework of the State Department's Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program, the John S. McCain International Scholarship for Military Families (Gilman-McCain Scholarship) is open to eligible students enrolled at accredited U.S. colleges and universities who receive any type of Title IV federal financial aid.

The Gilman-McCain Scholarship is a congressionally funded initiative of the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs at the U.S. Department of State and named after the late Senator John S. McCain from Arizona. With the support of the U.S. Congress, this scholarship honors Senator McCain's legacy of public service by enabling undergraduate children and spouses of active or activated United States military personnel to develop the leadership and career readiness skills and global perspective to pursue careers of service and contribute to preserving the principles and alliances that are critical to an international order based on the rule of law, human rights, and democracy.

- U.S. citizen or national
- Undergraduate student in good academic standing
- Dependent (child or spouse) of active or activated United States military personnel during the time of application (including Air Force, Air Force Reserve, Air National Guard, Army, Army National Guard, Army Reserve, Coast Guard, Coast Guard Reserve, Marine Corps, Marine Corps Reserve, Navy, Navy Reserve, Space Force, NOAA Commissioned Corps, and USPHS Commissioned Corps)
- Recipient of any type of Title IV federal financial aid
- In the process of applying for, or accepted to, a credit-bearing study abroad or internship program in a country with an overall Travel Advisory of 1 or 2, according to the U.S. Department of State Travel Advisory System

Award Amount

The Gilman-McCain Scholarship recipients are awarded \$5,000 to be used toward the cost of study abroad or international internship programs.
