# **Dance Choreography and Performance**



Dance celebrates human movement as an artistic expression. Dance productions involve choreography, performance, lighting, sound and video. With a degree in Dance, you will learn how to choreography creatively, develop performance skills, and gain knowledge in dance production.

The pathways program is recommended for students who wish to transfer credits to a university bachelor's degree program. It is required to consult your university transfer advisor to determine specific requirements.

Responsibilities may include:

- Performing various types of dance
- Designing performance lighting and sound
- Solo and group choreography
- Teaching dance
- Directing a dance production

### Associate of Arts, Fine Arts - Dance (AAFA):

The Associates in Arts, Fine Arts – Dance degree is designed for students planning to transfer to four-year colleges or universities. In general, the components of the degree meet requirements for majors in the Fine Arts. The degree is designed to prepare students to meet selective admissions criteria for programs such as a Bachelor of Fine Arts, which may require a portfolio or performance requirement.

#### **Program Notes:**

A grade of "C" or better is required for all courses within the program. P/Z classes do not apply to the degree. Students must enroll in three of the following styles of technique each semester: Ballet, Modern, Jazz and Hip Hop. Students must attain a level 3 in the following styles of technique before the can graduate: Ballet, Modern, Jazz.
