When using Safari as your web browser, remember to clear your cache often. This will ensure you are viewing the latest information on web sites.

1. Click on the **Safari** drop-down menu and select **Preferences**.



2. Click the **Advanced** tab. Select the Show **Develop menu in menu bar** checkbox and close the Preferences window.



3. Select the **Develop** drop-down menu. Then click on **Empty Caches**.
