

# How to Disable the Pop-up Blocker: A Comprehensive Guide

---

A pop-up blocker can be useful if you are not wanting random windows appearing, which can contain ads or spam. However, some websites require opening a pop-up window, which can be a form, information, a sign-in page, or a page that leads to an external website (such as accessing another website from your Canvas course, for example).

When you need to enable or disable pop-ups, please follow the steps listed according to your preferred browser:

## CHROME



### Method #1:

1. You will see a message in the address bar about a pop-up being blocked



2. Click on the pop-up blocked icon and you will see the following options:





- **Always allow:** The next time you open this website, future pop-ups will be allowed
- **Continue blocking:** Pop-ups will be or remain blocked on this website
- **Manage:** This will take you directly to Chrome’s pop-up settings


3. Select **Always allow...** to allow for pop-ups, then click on the **X** or **Done** button (You may have to refresh the page.)

### Method #2


1. In Chrome, go to the three dots icon and select **Settings**



2. Select **Privacy and security**, or search the phrase “pop-up” in the search bar
3. Select **Site Settings**, then click on **Pop-ups and redirects**



4. To allow for pop-ups, make sure you have selected **Sites can send pop-ups and use redirects**  
You can also set what websites are allowed or are not allowed if you would like to customize your settings. You can still list websites if you have a default setting selected



**Note: [\*.] allows or blocks popups for an entire website so you don't have to make exceptions for specific URLs or pages of a website**






## FIREFOX


### Method #1

1. You will see a message below the address bar about a pop-up being blocked
2. Click on the **Options** button and select which setting you want to have set for pop-ups in the future
  - Manage pop-up settings will take you to the **Permissions** section under the browser's settings



## Method #2

1. Go to the icon with the three lines found in the top right, and click on **Settings**
2. Then click on **Privacy and Security**



3. You will be taken to the **Permissions** section. From here you can enable or disable, or customize which websites are or are not allowed to have pop-ups under **Exceptions**

### Allowed Websites - Pop-ups

You can specify which websites are allowed to open pop-up windows. Type the exact address of the site you want to allow and then click Allow.

### Method #1



1. In Safari, if you have not made any changes to your settings yet, webpages will default to the **Block and Notify** setting for pop-ups. You will see this message with this setting:



2. Simply click on the message or the icon in the address bar and the blocked pop-up will open in a new tab or window


### Method #2

1. To change pop-up settings, go to the **Safari** tab and select **Preferences**
2. Go to the **Websites** and scroll down to **Pop-up Windows** and select it




- Changes can be made for each site, and they can be changed at any time


Websites that you have customized settings for will appear under **Configured Websites**



Websites you are currently visiting or have recently visited will appear under **Currently Open Websites**



Settings can also be made for all websites you visit by changing the setting under **When visiting other websites** pop-up menu. *You may have to clear your **Configured Websites** list before making this change.*




## INTERNET EXPLORER


### Method #1

1. A message will appear at the bottom of the browser window
2. You can select **Allow once** to permit pop-ups for just this instance, or under **Options for this site**, there are a couple of options:
  - **Always allow**: Will allow pop-ups on this site always
  - **More settings**: To view more settings options for pop-ups
  - Selecting the **x** will close the message and keep pop-ups blocked until otherwise changed



## Method #2

1. In Internet Explorer, go to the **Gear** icon in the top right



2. Select **Internet options**
3. Go to the **Privacy** tab. You can check the box to keep the pop-up blocker on, or uncheck it to turn off the pop-up blocker. Click on the **Settings** button to customize your settings, such as which websites are allowed to have pop-ups or not
