# WORD ORDER

Doctors	diagnose	patients' illnesses.
Nurses	are	responsible for taking care of patients.
Patients	complain	frequently.
They	complain	about the service in the hospital.

## Look at the order of the different parts of these sentences.

## Notice that all these sentences follow the same order.

Subject	Verb	Realization (what comes after the verb)

## Most sentences in English follow this Subject - Verb - Realization order.

If you follow this basic order when you write a sentence, your writing will be clearer.

## There are a few exceptions to this basic order of sentences:

### 1. Questions

Helping Verb	Subject	Main Verb	Realization
Do	hospitals	have	adequate sanitary conditions?
Have	hospitals	improved	infection control procedures?
Main Verb (BE Verb)	Subject	l	Realization
Are	hospitals		safe?

#### 2. Requests/Commands

Subject (implied but not said)	Verb	Realization
(you)	turn	the light on, please.
(you)	submit	your assignment on time.

## 3. Sentences with There is/There are \*

Dummy Subject	BE Verb	Actual Subject	Realization
There	is	a problem	that needs to be solved.
There	are	problems	that need to be solved.

\* Notice that in a sentence starting with *There is/There are*, *There* is not the subject. The subject comes after the verb. Make sure that the subject and the verb agree.

#### Common errors with word order:

Error	Incorrect	Correct
Missing subject	Is an important problem.	<u>It</u> is an important problem.
Missing there	In the country are many problems.	In the country, <u>there</u> are many problems.
Question word order used in a statement	The scientists do not know <u>why is</u> <u>the disease spreading.</u>	The scientists do not know <u>why</u> <u>the disease is spreading.</u>
